The City of Brenham has opened the door to waste reduction and awareness by purchasing a Diamond Z tub grinder. Since our purchase, mulch production and sales has steadily increased.

The City of Brenham Mulching Facility is designed to recycle yard waste, wood waste, leaves and grass clippings into a beneficial product called “Municipal Mulch” which benefits the entire community and its outlying areas.

Municipal Mulch is made by combining yard waste, wood waste and grass clippings together into a large stockpile. After stockpiling, the Diamond Z tub grinder takes over. First, the waste is ground through a set of 3 x 5 in. screens which produces wood chips. These wood chips are separated and stockpiled into larger piles to allow the mulching process to complete its cycle. After 4-6 months and adding water as needed, the woodchips are then double-ground through a set of 2 x 2 in. screens. These screens produce quality mulch, which has a finer texture and darker appearance.

From the intersection of Hwy 290 West and FM 577, drive north approximately 2.2 miles. Take a right on Old Chappell Hill Road and drive approximately 0.2 tenths of a mile. The facility is located on the left immediately past the Donald G. Austin Memorial Animal Shelter.

From the intersection of State Hwy 105 East and FM 577, drive approximately 0.6 tenths of a mile south on FM 577. Turn left on Old Chappell Hill Road and drive approx. 0.2 tenths of a mile. The facility is located on the left immediately past the Donald G. Austin Memorial Animal Shelter.
